Please be aware that our 'Peer Challenge' partners (i.e. the Headteachers who work together to support the monitoring and evaluation standards in each others' schools) and our independent professional adviser have spent time at Marlborough observing lessons, talking to children and looking at their books, scrutinising school performance data and meeting with team leaders as part of our termly review. We are delighted to report that they have validated our own self-evaluation which continues to judge the school as 'Good' with some 'Outstanding' and some 'Excellent' features. They also highlighted our key strengths as the overall high quality of teaching, the positive behaviours and attitudes of the pupils and the levels of support given to learners with Special Educational Needs and provision to ensure that for higher attaining pupils are appropriately challenged. In addition, our visitors concluded that we are making good progress in terms of our improvement priorities i.e. the development of pupils' writing skills and some curriculum areas such as Design Technology and Art and Design. They also recognised the challenges arising from the current teacher recruitment crisis in the London area and managing significant budget cuts and reinforced our view that addressing our declining attendance figures is of paramount importance, if we are to realise our aspiration of becoming an 'Outstanding' school in all areas.

Unfortunately our attendance figures for the Autumn Term have not shown the improvements we were hoping for. Whilst we are always grateful to the majority of parents/carers who always ensure that their children attend school regularly, there appears to be a significant proportion of families who still insist on taking their children out during term time e.g. to go on holiday and/ or to visit relatives or friends abroad. In addition, there are many examples of children who are persistent non-attenders on a specific pattern of days e.g. every Monday or Friday or are regularly and unnecessarily kept off school for extremely minor allments. Please be aware that there is a very strong link between good punctuality and attendance at school and good progress in learning, the opposite is also true. We would therefore wish to ask those parents/carers who find it challenging to support the school in this way, to consider the negative impact this has on their child's education and life chances and help our hard working teachers by ensuring their children attend regularly. ONGOING ROAD SAFETY ISSUES

Despite our ongoing pleas, there are still a significant minority of parents/carers who continue to refuse to help keep our children and other pedestrians safe by insisting on bringing their cars as close to the school as possible e.g. into Holdernesse Road and then driving and/or parking in an irresponsible, inconsiderate and illegal way. Unfortunately this includes behaviours such as mounting the kerb to park or turn their car around, parking across our neighbours driveways, obstructing the school gates thereby making it impossible for emergency vehicles to enter or exit the premises, driving whilst using mobile phones, failing to have their own children secured in appropriate child seats/belts and/or booster seats and even engaging in abusive or even threatening interactions with others when challenged. This issue has been raised again by a concerned local neighbourhood group who sent a representative to meet with Mr Murrell and a Hounslow Council officer before the Christmas break. During this meeting they went out to directly observe the situation at the end of the school day and were very disappointed to note the volume of cars around the school, some poor driving behaviour and even witnessed a parent becoming argumentative when challenged about parking across a neighbours driveway.

Although we are very grateful to the majority of our parents/carers who always try to ensure that their children walk to school along with those who do drive and park with due care and consideration, we are determined to work even harder with the council, the police, our parents/carers and our neighbours to find a solution which minimises the level of risk. This is likely to include the issuing of tickets in the short term and restricted access and parking in the longer term. In the meantime we would like to encourage as many parents/carers as possible to support the school by enabling their children to walk to school whenever possible.
