MUFTI DAY IN AID OF STURGE WEBER SYNDROME We are sure that you will join us in congratulating our Learning Support Assistant, Samantha Matthews and her husband Karl on the birth of their second son Riley.

Although the family are doing well, Riley was born on the 15th November 2017 with a port wine stain birth mark and after an MRI scan has been diagnosed with Sturge Weber Syndrome (SWS). This rare condition comes with complications that may include: epilepsy, glaucoma, hemiplegia and learning difficulties. Children with SWS have a range of disability from mildly affected to severe. The outlook for each child varies greatly from child to child, depending on the severity of the symptoms and how well they are controlled. Samantha and Karl have set up a Just Giving page to raise awareness for the Sturge-Weber UK charity. Karl will be participating in a 10 km obstacle course to raise funds.
